

# IS THIS THE END OF O-GAGE?

The following article is written with the thought in mind of helping you make up your mind whether or not you would like to continue model railroading in O-Gage.

Many magazines have had countless words telling you about the advantages of model railroading—what a wonderful hobby it is, how it actually developes creative ability, the importance of it from a health standpoint, the advantages as a family or father and son project and many other reasons. It is not my purpose to repeat these advantages here. Instead I must assume that you have been touched with one or more of them, and that today you either partially or wholly participate in the hobby.

It is not my purpose either to sell you on O-Gage and the advantages it offers from a realism standpoint with its greater detail, smoother and more dependable operation, or to point outthat those who model railroad in O-Gage are expressing themselves in the true American manner of owning the finest.

My purpose is this; to give you facts about O-Gage model railroading which may or may not make it possible for you to continue in this gage, free from the fear that the investment which you have made in your model pike will be lost, and that you will not be able to pursue that which gives you so much enjoyment.

Today on all sides, many O-Gage model rail-roaders are told that O-Gage is dead. Added to this are rumors that certain O-Gage manufacturers are going out of business, and that it will no longer be possible to buy their parts or products. From the many letters we have had from you model railroaders telling us about these remarks, we feel that it is high time that we struck back with the truth—giving you the facts.

O-Gage is not dead—it is a long way from being dead. It is true that *percentage-wise*, there are more model railroaders in HO than in O-Gage, but actually today there are more O-Gagers than ever before in the history of model railroading. It is just a case of there being more model railroaders in all gages.

HO gage has gained its great popularity for three reasons: 1. To many persons, "It is cute." 2. It will operate on shorter radii, and thus less space. 3. Until recently it has been less expensive. Now let us look at each of the three reasons in more detail.

#### CUTE?

Yes, HO gage is cute. Sometimes a layman wonders how manufacturers can make some of the little products they do, so that they actually work. But is that what we, as model railroaders want? I believe that we want more than just a cute car or locomotive. I believe that we want to feel that we have that empire. I believe that we derive satisfaction from the added realism of operation and the dependability of operation that we get in O-Gage. I do not believe that we model railroad because we think it is cute.

Possibly it is because of the "cute" aspect, which began to manifest itself with the advent of HO gage, that has caused many to view model railroading as "men playing with toys." In O-Gage you can create a true depth realization because it is possible to present the normal picture in a comprehensible manner as the human eye sees it at ground level. In other words it is realistically railroading as we see it when we are on the ground and not as we might see it from any airplane. We can actually see each function of each car and locomotive without the aid of a magnifying glass or without moving to within a few inches of each object.

#### SHORTER RADII

Ever since the war O-Gage manufacturers have been working to make it possible for their products to operate in smaller space and on shorter radii. The results of their efforts are known facts today. The largest locomotives which here-to-fore have required 72" radii have now been cut \*\*x0 48". And your average size units will now operate on 36" radii with some in the steam class actually going down to 30" and 33". Modern, superdetailed road diesels and diesel switchers will actually operate on Lionel 0-27 track with its 13½" radius.

Model railroaders with a little imagination and exercise of their creative ability have done wonders with small space. They have realized that they did not have the time and the money or the space to create the universe and have therefore done excellent jobs within all of these limitations. The space problem in most instances is one of our imaginations, not one of walls or feet and inches.

#### COSTS?

All of the fine modern conveniences we have today, television, radio, automobiles, washing machines, etc., are the result of the desires of men to improve—to feel the satisfaction of owning the best. Cadillac and Lincoln automobiles and many other products are purchased because of that same desire to own the best. One man will pay \$125.00 for a suit of clothes and the next will pay \$35.00. The man who buys the \$125.00 suit does so for several reasons. First he wants the best and secondly he has learned that quality will, many times, outlast several of the inferior or cheaper grades.

But what makes one item cost more than another? Usually it is the material and labor that are put into the product. In model railroading, for example, why does, or has, O-Gage cost more than HO? Is it because O-Gage manufacturers are getting richer faster than HO Gage manufacturers? Emphatically, No! And most certainly is this true with General Models Corporation. It is only sound business that a company makes a certain amount of money, for only by making money are there the funds to make new products and to further develop lines to the best interests of the consumer. It is only by making money that funds become available for the improvement of current products. In GMC's fiscal year which closed June 30th, 1949, the net profit of this company was .009c on each dollar of merchandise sold. This is certainly in no way comparable to the 6c to 10c of profit on the sales dollar of most all items you buy. To clearly get this point home this means that if you purchased a GMC box car for \$2.95, our net profit was .0265c.

Frankly this is not sound business, especially when viewed from a month to month basis. But we feel it is sound when viewed from the long term point of view. It is true, that we could have raised the prices of our merchandise and thus would have made a greater profit. But again we

have felt that you wanted and expected lower prices.

Being a relatively new company, constantly expanding our line, we have made huge expenditures in dies, expensive dies that give you superdetailed parts, and lots of them. Many of these dies are for the making of the extra parts, found only in O-Gage. Because the unit volume of O-Gage is not comparable with that of the toy train or even HO, it means that a larger amount of money per part is necessary for each of the additional parts. These are just business economics which all too often a customer does not realize. We feel that you should know and understand why there has been the amount of difference in the cost of O-Gage and HO. Too, there is eight times the volume in an O-Gage car and locomotive as compared to HO.

However, even with all of these extra cost factors, O-Gage products, especially General Models products, are more than competitive with HO. If the time should ever come when unit volumes drop below a safety point, it can only result in higher prices to 'you.

Recently in an effort to bring you "Cadillac" model railroading at "Ford" prices, we changed our entire selling procedure. We eliminated the middle man. We were fully aware of the fact that our own selling and advertising costs would increase, but we still felt that it would be possible for us to pass on to you much of the savings of the normal distribution costs.

By and large what we have done in offering you these products at lower prices has been more than appreciated by our customers. So much so that many write us and tell us of the condemnation that some dealers heap upon us because our products are not sold thru their channels. We are in the business of serving model railroader individualsnot for the benefit of distribution channels. Another and very important factor that caused us to change our selling policies was the fact that most dealers would not stock O-Gage and thus render service to you. They were only selfishly interested in those items which they could move constantly. They too often overlooked the fact that their basic function as a hobby dealer, was to render service to all customers, be they O-Gage enthusiasts or HO followers.

Now what we have done—that of selling direct—was done for your best interests. It means lower prices and an opportunity to enjoy your hobby without working too great a hardship on the family purse. It means too that you can enjoy the finest in model railroading—O-Gage—at prices comparably LOWER than HO.

But the question of whether O-Gage is to continue lies with you. If you like your hobby—like your gage and appreciate that which is being done to help you, then you will support this type of operation. You will defend it against those who would ruin your investment by attempting to run down the gage and those manufacturers
